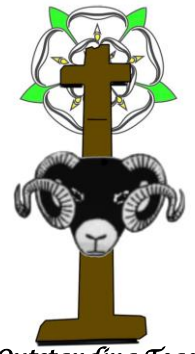

News from the Classes

In **KS1** this week we have been exploring the Amazon Rainforest and were particularly interested in researching the different animals that live in the different layers of the rainforest.

We ventured into our own rainforest on Wednesday afternoon – we didn't let the rain stop us for our Forest School session, we simply put up a shelter over our camp area and carried on! The beauty of being in broad leaf woodland is that the canopy acts like a giant umbrella anyway and we had great fun lighting fires and making necklaces from natural materials.

Our caterpillars have been busy making their chrysalis and we have enjoyed observing the whole process first hand – it is fascinating to watch and we will keep you posted.

KS2: The more you look into electrical circuits the trickier they become. We have been thinking about the appropriate battery voltage for the bulbs and buzzers. It is important to get the voltage right or you blow the bulb (the buzzers seem to survive annoyingly!) We also solved the mystery of the buzzer, it was all to do with polarity and the red and black wires (please ask). The next step is to think about LEDs, but you really need to think about the correct voltage for those or it overheats.

On Monday the years 5 and 6 children were invited to a careers day at Caedmon College where they could try some new things and think about what sort of jobs they might want to do in future. They got a chance to take part in all sorts of activities that the College has to offer, and to meet students from who have just finished their A-levels and ask them questions about College life. Children made decorative clay tiles in the art classroom, cycled around the sports field, banged drums in the music room and did exciting chemistry experiments in the science block but everybody's favourite bit by far was pizza lunch in the cafeteria, which felt very grown up! Thank you to Becky Webster for going with them.

On Tuesday afternoon, most of KS2 went to Whitby Beach for "Hit the Surf" and what an amazing time everyone had. Once we had fought with our wet suits we were shown some important life guard skills and had a go at surfing and fantastically some children even managed to stand up which is definitely not as easy as it looks! Thanks to Dan Medcalf for coming along and joining in with us.
