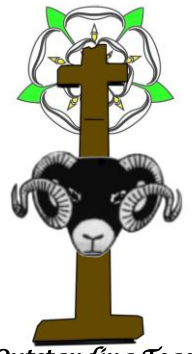

## News from the Classes

This week in **KS1**, we have had a surprising discovery of eggs in our garden area, some children suspect that they are dinosaur eggs and have been putting their detective skills to work, collecting clues and evidence. We will keep you updated!

Reception have created a lovely fairy garden and enjoyed using the outdoor area to find sticks and logs, we just need the sun to shine now so that the seeds grow!

In English we have been looking at different sentence types and working out the grammar we need for each. We love stories in KS1 and next Thursday is World Book Day so the children have been thinking about their favourite books and characters. We can't wait to see what everyone comes up with and celebrate our love of Literacy.

On Wednesday, the Police came in and talked to **KS2** (and year 2) about being safe on the internet. This has made us all think how important it is to think about safety. It is really important that other people on computers can't get our codes/passwords. Always think safety!

We have been working on number sequences this week. It has been important to get your brain thinking. Ask about ascending and descending order. Ask about finding the difference. Well done year 4, you have been working on trickier negative numbers.

We have also been working on Fronted Adverbials; they are not as scary as first thought! This is because we have always been using them with our sentence types anyway. Numbers 5, 7, 12 and 13 all have a Fronted Adverbial start.

In Geography, we have been working on Biomes – please ask. We understand that different environments occur because of how close or far they are from the Equator. It explains why the Earth shows different colours from Space.

Also, please note that the same rules apply at the end of clubs as at the end of the school day:-

- Please could you let us know if your children are going to someone else's house;
- If your child is allowed to walk home or elsewhere from school, on their own, we must have written permission from you;
- Your child needs to be collected on time at the end of a club.
