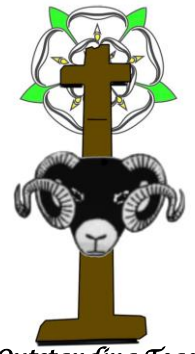

## News from the Classes

In **KS1** this week, we have enjoyed making props for the play and are excited to show you next week. Thank you for the costumes.

## News from Glaisdale

**Class 1** has also been working on Pirate Pete this week, by innovating and extending the story with their own compositions which involved working on them over a number of days, editing and improving them, resulting in some wonderful adventures for Pete! In Maths they have been looking at different methods for adding two and three numbers together and Mr Wilson has begun teaching them gymnastic techniques in PE in preparation for a January interschool competition. Much work this week has also been devoted to rehearsing their Christmas production.

**Class 2** has been looking at different ways of adding information to sentences and in Maths they have continued looking at shape through reflection and symmetry. In PE, years 3 and 4 were learning how to mark and dodge using space, while years 5 and 6 were developing their own rules for games such as "Crazy catch" nets. Year 6 also discovered how difficult it is to referee a game. In Science they have continued with investigations into light.
