News from the Classes

It was lovely to have a whole day of forest school this week, and KS1 benefitted from the longer morning session. This meant that we had time for using tools like bow saws, hand drills and peelers, as well as hot chocolate and snack and roasting marshmallows on the fire!

Years 5 and 6 had an afternoon session and were joined by Mrs Barlow, a School Governor. They had the choices of using tools, den building and photography. We all enjoyed hot chocolate and a snack around the campfire and, of course, roasted marshmallows!

As ever, the sessions were most enjoyable as everyone participated with relaxed enthusiasm and excellent behaviour.

This week in **KS1** we have made an exciting discovery of an alien egg! We are taking good care of it whilst looking for more clues and information. This has led us to write our own, "We're going on an Alien Hunt" stories. In Maths we have been learning about capacity and made charts to present our findings.

This week in Maths, **KS2** have been looking deeper into angles - some naming, some calculations, eliminating and measuring. It is also important to know that angles are used for turn as well, so $\frac{1}{4}$ turn = 90° (please ask). The World Book Day stories have been completed, it is great to see how they have edited and improved their work in exactly the same way a real author would.

The Peter Thorpe inspired artwork is also looking great, with rockets blasting into unknown galaxies (please ask).

Thanks to all who came to see our Year 3 and 4 pupils perform at the Wider Opportunities music afternoon at Eskdale School last Friday and to Becky Webster for accompanying our children. They have been working very hard on Friday mornings with Mr Cross to learn the pieces that were played and it sounded extraordinary!
