Wellbeing Club

As discussed in last week's newsletter, Redcar & Cleveland Mind are hoping to start a wellbeing club after February half-term for children aged 9-11. This club will aim to give children a safe space to talk about their mental health as well as the opportunity to speak 1:1 with a trained counsellor about any issues they may be having. This club will take place on Tuesdays and be open to children aged 9-11 but will likely prioritise those children who would most benefit from this support.

After School Care

Please note: this will be a paid for service. For children attending between 3.15-4.15pm, parents will be charged £3. If a child attends after 4.15pm (until 5.15pm at the latest) the total charge for that child will be £5. There will be small discounts for additional siblings attending the club. Children will be provided with a small snack/drink as part of this service.

Please note: this club will be provided on a trial basis, so that we can understand its viability. This will continue until the end of the summer term, although we may make changes sooner if there are time slots that are not popular.

We will confirm the start date of this service in due course.


Parental Survey Feedback - January 2023

The following summarises the feedback from the recent parental survey and, where appropriate, outlines the next steps school will take to act on this feedback. Feedback has been anonymised, so individual comments will not necessarily be reported.

Extending the School Day

To align with the national requirement to provide 32.5 school hours per week by September 2023, we asked parents to comment on their preference for extending the school day. We have also asked staff and considered how this would best work for our children's curriculum.

We have decided that a 9am-3.30pm school day would provide the opportunity for a more rounded curriculum and better suit the majority of parents/staff. However, we recognise that there may be some exceptions to this.




Therefore, we will look to trial this new school day in due course (likely after Easter) to understand the impact of this on families. Confirmed arrangements will be communicated in due course via the school newsletter

Parents' Suggestions on Improving Children's Transition to Secondary School

- Extend the length of transition to several weeks over the summer term.
- Linking with other Year 6s at the other local small schools.
- Using teachers from the secondary school to teach lessons at Castleton.
- Using former students (e.g. Year 7s) who can link with our current Year 6s
- Making links with other non-Whitby secondary schools

Thank you for all your suggestions. Where these are practical, we will raise with the local secondary schools at the Whitby Area Heads Meeting (held termly). As you may be aware, especially if you have a child preparing for secondary school, there has been a change in circumstances regarding the Whitby secondary schools which may affect what transition looks like this year – we will communicate details of this once this has been made clear.


School Meals




We are pleased to hear that the majority of applicable parents rate our meals as adequate or better. Your suggestions will be passed on to NYCC County Caterers, who decide on the menu. However, we will work with our School Council to gauge which meals children would like to see on the menu and providing these through, perhaps, a themed lunch day.

Behaviour Perceptions

We are delighted to hear that the parental perception of behaviour is extremely positive from the responses given. There has been an acknowledgement from some parents that this has improved a lot over the last academic year and that this coincides with a better understanding (from teachers, parents and children) of individual children's needs and how this may impact on behaviour. We recognise that there will still be isolated incidents of misbehaviour which we will work very hard to manage and improve.

School Oaths



We are pleased to hear that the majority of applicable parents are aware of our school oaths (which are displayed on the school gate). However, a significant proportion of our parents are not aware of these. Therefore, to review these oaths, and to ensure they reflect the personality of the school, our

next survey will review these. We will then look to make these more explicit to parents and children.

Trips

Again, we received very positive feedback on school trips at Castleton. However, the following suggestions were given, which we will take under consideration and look to act upon:

- Increase visits for Acorns
- School newspaper club visiting the Whitby Gazette
- Using the local area as much as possible
- Visiting cities as much as possible

Clubs

This is an area that we have made a concentrated effort to improve at the start of this term, along with the help of the School Council. This has allowed us to already act on some of the feedback given in this survey. However, the following additional suggestions were provided:

- Increase clubs for Acorns
- Homework Club (or achieve this at a wrapround club)
- Martial arts club in the future

Next Survey Ideas

- Break time snacks
- Special meals throughout the year
- Thoughts on how they think their child is getting on at school
- How to involve the school with the local community
- Impact of cost of living
- Uniform
- Extra-curricular
- Music/arts
- Performances

Where appropriate, we will look to work on some of these before our next survey. However, later in the year, we will aim to survey parents on as many of these areas as possible.
