Phoebe Update

Several of you have been asking for a Phoebe update, so here it is!

Phoebe is now 6 weeks old (33 weeks by gestation) and is now old enough and big enough to have been transferred to Scarborough Special Care Baby Unit where she continues to make good progress. She is now out of her incubator and in a cot where she is maintaining her temperature. Phoebe is still being tube fed but now weighs 4lbs 14oz (2lbs 4oz more than her birth weight!) She still requires a small amount of oxygen support but she is slowly weaning off this.

With all this progress, if it continues, we are hoping that Phoebe will be able to make an earlier return to home than anticipated, possibly the end of February! When she is able to return, I intend to take flexible paternity leave to suit the needs of myself and the school. This may mean I will be away from school for parts of a week, rather than a full two weeks, attending essential meetings and being contactable in emergencies, so that school is not disrupted but giving us time as a family to share the first few weeks at home.

Thank you again for all your support and kind words over this challenging period. I would also like to say a massive thank you for those of you who very generously bought gifts for Phoebe – this was certainly unexpected but very much appreciated.
