#### Welcome Back!

It has been a pleasure to see 50 happy, enthusiastic and well-rested children this week. Everyone at Castleton has 'hit the ground running', exploring their new topics. A special mention must be made to our new starters in Acorns who have done a wonderful job settling into their school!

Last year was extremely successful in a range of ways for the school and we wish continue to build on this. You can find, below, some of the upcoming changes to our practice which will allow the school to be an even better place to nurture our children.

#### **Class Dojo**

In the coming weeks, we will be moving more of our communication over to the home-school communication/behaviour application, Class Dojo. Some of you will be familiar with this, especially if your child used this during remote learning. We currently use this in school as a way to track children's 'Dojo points' for positive effort and behaviour. However, Class Dojo also has other capabilities which will allow us to better communicate between school and home. This includes class pages which can only be accessed by parents of children in the class, which can provide updates on homework and reminders on what children may need for school. There is also a whole-school page with an events calendar which we will start to populate with the key dates parents need to know. This area will also provide timed reminders of upcoming events.

One of the final key features of Class Dojo is the direct messaging system between parent and teacher. We hope to use this feature for any general home-school communication. However, this will not be used outside of working hours and should not be used for urgent updates (e.g. when a child is being collected by a different adult).

In the coming weeks, you will receive login details to your child's account (some of you may be able to access existing accounts already). Please can we encourage you to download the Class Dojo app to your smart devices, in readiness. You can find more information about Class Dojo here: <u>https://www.classdojo.com/</u>

Please note: Class Dojo is a free application, there is no need to purchase any of the additional add-ons which may be available for home learning.

## **Poverty Proofing**

Another way we are looking to improve the school experience is through 'poverty proofing'. Those of you that were with us last year may recall we conducted a poverty audit, to see how school costs impact upon our families and so that we can consider alternatives to events that cause unnecessary cost or stress, especially to those families that may be suffering from poverty or the cost of living crisis – things which affect a larger proportion of our community than we realised before the audit.

You will receive a letter from the Yorkshire Endeavour Academy Trust's CEO outlining further information on the changes we are making and why we are doing so. As stated in this letter, we recognise that some of these changes may be difficult to adjust to at first and may feel like we are missing out on some of the most memorable parts of the school calendar, however, please be reassured that we will endeavour to find alternatives that will allow all children to access these.

This week, we have shared some of these upcoming changes with our children, who have been extremely mature and understanding of why we are making these, despite being slightly disappointed that some of the





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things they have done previously may change. It was emphasised amongst children that we will still continue to mark special events and continue to do the things they enjoy in school but that these may look a little different, so that all children can access.

## **Forest Schools**

Acorns' Forest School sessions will start on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> September. These will take place fortnightly, unless otherwise stated.

Year 3/4's first Forest School session will take place on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September with Mrs Barber.

Year 5/6's first Forest School session will take place on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September with Mrs Barber.

Future Forest School sessions for Oaks will be communicated in due course.

On days when children have these sessions, they may come to school in their appropriate outdoor clothing/footwear, which they can wear throughout the day. They will not require uniform.

## PE

Acorns will have PE sessions every Monday (starting from 11<sup>th</sup> September) with Mr Sellers.

Acorns will also have PE sessions on alternate Wednesdays (starting from 20<sup>th</sup> September) on weeks they do not have Forest School. These will be led by Mrs Wardell (our PE specialist from Glaisdale School and previous Head of Sport at Bridlington Secondary School).

Oaks will have PE sessions on Tuesdays (with Mrs Wardell) and Fridays (with Mr Sellers), every week.

Children should come to school in appropriate PE clothing/footwear on the days they have PE. They may wear this throughout the day and do not require uniform.
