Parental Survey Feedback

Thank you to everyone that responded to our parental survey regarding uniform, wrapround care and children's progress. A summary of the responses and the action the school is going to take can be found later in this newsletter.

Uniform

Following the parental survey feedback, we have decided to change our uniform supplier so that it is more cost effective for parents. French Lessons

After half-term, I am pleased to say that we will be joined by Madame Cordingley who will be teaching both classes French lessons once per week. Mr Cooper or Mr Sellers will be able to deal with any urgent queries on the day Miss Gosling is not in school.

School Council

The School Council and I have been working hard on our first project: playground development. The children have surveyed the school to find out what ideas everyone has to improve their breaks and lunches. We will soon be looking to upgrade our equipment and storage facilities, so that children have a better range and quality of activities to do during the week. I have also been in touch with several companies to look into the possibility of installing astroturf on our playground!





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
In response to this feedback, with the majority of parents expressing the opinion that our current uniform provider is too expensive and/or that they would be satisfied with a cheaper supplier, we have decided to change our uniform provider to SchoolShop (more details listed above in the newsletter).

We have decided to maintain the requirement of having a school logo on the school jumper and cardigan, but all other items can be 'non-branded'.

Wrapround Care



Wrapround care: We are considering extending our Breakfast Club provision so that it begins at 7.45am. How many times a week would you make use of this facility should this become available?




Which items of uniform do you believe should contain the school logo? (select multiple if this applies)



Wraparound care: We are considering providing childcare after-school. This would be chargeable and separate from extracurricular club provision (for which children should want to attend regular, rather than be used simply for childcare). Following this feedback, the school is going to *consider* a trial of extending Breakfast Club provision and offering some after school care. However, this will be subject to having appropriate staffing in place. We will communicate our plans on this in due course.



We are pleased that the majority of our parents feels that they are aware of their child's progress and are confident in supporting at home.
