End of Term Message

What a fantastic term we have had! It is a pleasure to look back on all the achievement the school, staff and children have made over the last 3 months. It is a shame that the weather has interrupted some of our end of term events and trips but that is part of living and working in the countryside!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support over my first term at Castleton. I have thoroughly enjoyed working hard for our children and feel we have a bright and promising future ahead. I hope you feel the same and that you feel your views have been listened to and acted upon wherever possible. We have tried to introduce positive change wherever we can, whether that is through extending Breakfast Club hours; sourcing a cheaper uniform provider; running more trips, special events and performances or by making smaller changes that have a positive impact on school/home life, such as changing policy on PE kits, homework and water bottles. I hope to introduce further positive change in the new term by addressing some of the further feedback we have received regarding the larger class size we have in Oaks and providing additional clubs. I would like to gauge your views further on other issues too (please see below for a link to a new questionnaire).

This term, the staff, governors and I have worked hard to identify some key priorities for the school on its improvement journey. I would like to take this opportunity to share these with you (see below). Please note that this is not all that we plan to do to improve our school but highlights the key areas in our development planning to make Castleton even better for our children. Our priorities are:

- Further develop teaching and learning across the curriculum with a focus on the foundation subjects (subjects other than English, maths and science).
- To improve the progress of vulnerable/targeted groups of learners, including children in receipt of Pupil Premium; those with special needs or disabilities; children who previous attained the highest standards; children who speak English as an additional language.
- To promote even better behaviour, attitudes and attendance through a nurturing approach, creating children who are ready to be confident citizens in modern Britain.

We have, fortunately, been in discussions with the activity providers about alternate dates in January. We will communicate this as soon as arrangements have been confirmed. Thank you for your understanding.

You will soon receive (if you haven't already) some permission forms for some new clubs that we will be running in the new term. Signing Club and Choir Club will recommence in the week commencing 9th January 2023 and there is no need to sign up again for these – however contact the school office if your child would like to attend and has not signed up previously.

On Wednesdays (3.15-4.15pm), Mr and Mrs Kevan will be running a website/journalism club for children in Key Stage 2. The children will have the opportunity to make their own website where they will be able to display a school newspaper! This combines two different ideas the School Council requested, based on the feedback from other pupils, using aspects of computing and journalism in one encompassing club. We are in the process of confirming other clubs for the new term too, including a Board Games club and some martial arts taster sessions from Evolution MMA. However, these are subject to ensuring we have enough volunteers and appropriate safeguarding checks in place.

Children's Termly Reports

On the previous parental feedback, the majority of parents requested a short termly report so that they could understand their child's current progress. After Christmas, once we have compiled the recent assessment information, we will be sending out this short report, outlining how well your child is achieving in English and maths, based on a nationally standardised assessment and teachers' own assessments (as we know this can sometimes vary). We will also report on your child's current attendance and how this compares locally/nationally. We hope you will find this a useful update – we would appreciate your feedback on this new system.
