Nurture School

Castleton is on its journey to achieving the status of a 'Nurture UK School'. This award recognises those schools who strive to support children's development (in all forms) through a nurturing approach, following the six principles listed on the image.

We want to better communicate this journey and how we demonstrate these principles in our practice through our future newsletters, as well as keep you updated with our progress on our submission later this year.

School Timings Questionnaire

School Meal Tasting Session for All Children

North Yorkshire Council Caterers have recognised that school meal provision over the last couple of years has, at times, fallen below the standards expected, especially when our regular cook has not been available. To restore the school's and children's confidence in this provision, NYC Caterers will be running a special 'tasting session' on Thursday 15th June 2023. Please see the posters below for more information. All children (regardless of whether they usually have a school meal or packed lunch) may engage with this at no additional cost. Children will be able to eat their regular meal for that day, as well as have the chance to taste the options listed below.

Road Safety – 20s Plenty Campaign and Petition Arranged by Whitby Community Network

Whitby Community Network, alongside Dr Ian Suckling (Cycling UK area representative) and Dr Margaret Jackson (General Practitioner) are running a petition to apply pressure on North Yorkshire Council to reduce speed limits in Whitby and the Esk Valley to 20mph. This is part of the 20s Plenty for us scheme which has been used in other areas of the county.

On Monday 12th June, the organisers are hoping to deliver a letter, by bicycle, to all Whitby and Esk Valley schools and GPs. They will also be leaving a paper petition and suitable lesson materials regarding road safety and active travel. Key Stage 2 Trip to Newcastle

Taxi Requirement

With these changes in clubs, we have contacted you to update your taxi requirements (for those children that use this service). Please ensure you respond to school giving this information, as well as informing the taxi company, so that any confusion is prevented at the end of the school day.

If you have stated that you would like your child on the taxi on a given afternoon, they will be placed on the taxi unless a parent/carer has contacted school to confirm that this is not the case. Please do not pass this message through children.

Outdoor Learning/PE & Quad Kids

Oaks will be having PE sessions on Wednesdays next half-term (unless other school events occur on this day). These sessions will be taught by Mrs Wardell from Glaisdale School.

Oaks outdoor learning sessions, therefore, may appear on different days of the week for the next half-term. This is also due to all the different events occurring during the summer term, meaning we will be unable to offer a 'regular' day/time of week. The outdoor learning day for Oaks will be communicated in each week's newsletter.
