England vs Spain

You should have received a letter from YEAT senior leaders outlining that children may arrive later to school on Monday (at break time) if they have taken the opportunity to watch our England men's football team compete in the final of Euro 2024! This will be an authorised absence until breaktime (10.30am). A school lunch will be ordered for all children unless you notify us otherwise. We hope this gives children the opportunity to enjoy the game as well as have a good night's sleep after, hopefully, a positive result!

Sports Day

Currently, the forecast is changeable/poor for this day/time. Year 6 Crucial Crew Visit

Our Year 6s will get the chance to visit 'Crucial Crew' next Wednesday afternoon. This is an event where they will get practical experiences of how to keep safe, delivered through interactive workshops led by our emergency services. Children will be attending with students from Glaisdale School. They will leave school mid-morning and return to school by 4pm (traffic-permitting). Children should wear their usual uniform and bring their own packed lunch from home (unless they have ordered one from school).

Oaks Trip to York

Oaks have the wonderful opportunity to attend a free trip to York Museums Trust who are piloting a new trip for schools called 'Time Odyssey', where they will meet four characters who are lost in time: Revna – the Viking, Cheng – a trainee scribe from Ancient China, Felix – a future Centurion from Roman Britain, and Hori – a tomb painter from Ancient Egypt. Pupils then choose a character and take on a series of challenges to help send them back home. How? By gathering enough energy from museum objects to open a time portal!

Our bus will be departing at 8.30am, so please can we ask children to arrive, in uniform, at 8.15am. Children will need their own packed lunch (unless they have ordered one from school) and their own drink. The children will arrive back to school at 3.30pm (traffic-permitting).

Leavers' Assembly

All school community members are welcome to join us for our Year 6 Leavers' Assembly which is taking place at school on Friday 19th July (1pm). This will be a celebration of our fantastic Year 6s before they leave for secondary school, as well as a chance to reflect on another successful year and provide awards to a range of children. Year 6 children are welcome to leave and go home after the event should their parent/responsible adult be in school to collect them.

YEAT Olympics and Final Day of Term

A reminder that our official final school day is Monday 22nd July. All children will be attending a YEAT Olympics day at Oakridge School. This will take place during usual school hours. Children should come to school in PE kit and footwear with their own packed lunch and drink from home.

Clubs in Autumn 2024 and Consultation on Paid-for Childcare

In September, we plan to run a range of after-school clubs (free of charge), as usual. Therefore, we are consulting families on whether they require additional paid-for childcare on days where there are no clubs available for their child or if childcare is required after clubs have finished (4.30pm).
