Dear Families and Friends,

Attendance

Last year, our attendance levels improved for a 2nd consecutive year, and we have started this year well. This is very important for children's learning. There is a direct link between children's attendance at school and their academic progress and attainment, as well as how they form and maintain relationships with their peers and teachers.

Our improvement bucks the trend when compared to the national attendance averages which have dropped significantly over recent years. Over the summer holidays, you may have heard via the media that the Government is changing the rules on attendance, implementing stricter rules on what absences schools/Headteachers can authorise, as well as making it a statutory requirement that schools pass on attendance concerns to the Local Authority who must issue penalty notices. Furthermore, these penalty notices have now increased in severity. Alongside this newsletter, parents will have been provided with an overview of these changes.

To confirm, despite a more relaxed approach to absence in the past, the Yorkshire Endeavour Academy Trust will be legally obligated to enforce these new rules. Should you have any questions about this, please contact Mr Cooper via the school office.
