#### **Co-op Fundraising**

A massive thank you to all the community members who chose our school as their Co-op local cause over the last 18 months. Every time your purchased at a Co-op store, using your member card, an amount was donated to our fundraising project – providing sensory sessions for children at Senses Wellbeing Centre. ### Forest School and Farm/Fire Safety Visit

As we enter the wintry months and our Christmas preparations, our Forest School sessions will be coming to an end in the next few weeks.
