Forest School

Forest School sessions will recommence after half-term, with Year 3/4 and Acorns having a session in the first week back. See the diary dates section below for future dates. Please ensure children arrive in suitable, weather-appropriate clothing for these sessions. As a reminder, our site, in the summer months, often has long grass and nettles, so we request that longer trousers are worn for all sessions. Please also note that, like other active/PE activities, pupils should avoid wearing loose jewellery (e.g. bracelets) which could become caught during climbing activities.

Year 1 Phonics Screening and Year 4 Multiplication Check

After half-term, our Year 1s and Year 4s have some low-key assessments.

Year 1 children complete their national phonics screening assessment which checks their understanding and acquisition of phonics. This takes place in the week commencing 9th June, with children completing their assessment of reading 40 unseen words alongside their teacher. Year 4 children will be completing the national multiplication tables check, testing their knowledge of multiplication facts. They will complete this on a computer alongside a teacher, answering 25 times table questions. This will be completed in the first two weeks of the new half-term.
