News from the Classes

It has been so lovely to see all of the *Acorns* back in school this week for the start of our Summer Term. Lots of smiley faces from everyone and wobbly teeth amongst the KS1 children!

In English we have been listening to and reading part of a traditional West African tale about Anansi the Spider and the moss covered rock. This has been enjoyed by all and fits really nicely into our studies for Geography, Music and Art this half term. We have looked at synonyms and writing instructions.

In Maths, Reception have been exploring the teen numbers and becoming familiar with all aspects related to them. Year 1 have been counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s. Year 2 have been exploring recognising and finding halves and quarters as an introduction to Fractions.

We had the most splendid weather on Wednesday morning for our forest school session and the daffodils in the woodland were tremendous. Lots of happy pupils and staff enjoying the fresh air and space whilst playing team challenges, making crafts, climbing trees, building dens, hunting for mini beast and using tools.

We also welcomed back Mrs Porter who has covered 2 sessions this week to the delight of the children!

Please can children bring their PE kit bag in on Monday to leave in school. They will go home wearing their PE kit on Thursday, with uniform in their bag, to save a little time.

The Acorn Star of the Week is Gabriella who has made an excellent start to the Summer Term being mindful not to interrupt, listen carefully and read instructions.

Once again the *Oaks* have returned with enthusiasm and ready for action this week. In Maths, the Year 5/6 children have been working with metric measurements and conversions. They even helped measure the broken play equipment so that we can get a quote to have it renewed. Fingers crossed that they were precise enough! The Year 3/4 children have continued with fractions: counting in different fractions, making the whole and adding fractions.

They have also recapped the features of an explanation and have written their own about volcanoes and eruptions. They have ensured to edit for detail and expansion of some of their sentences.

In RE, the Y5/6 children learnt about different Christian charities and linked these to the Rights Respecting Schools Award. The Y3/4 children learnt about the Trinity (The Father, Son and Holy Spirit) and thought about how they may take different forms.

We have also started our special Arts Award by beginning to spot the different arts in school. Can they see more at home and out and about?
