## News from the Classes

This week the Acorns have started their Arts Award journey by exploring the school grounds to find different art forms. They enjoyed working in pairs to hunt around the classroom and they amazed us with all of their discoveries. They drew pictures and wrote lists of their findings. It was lovely to see their enthusiasm and excitement in this activity. The children have also started to learn a Kenyan folk song, "Kipenzi Changu," so if you hear some interesting songs at home it is Swahili!

The work has continued in English on Anansi the Spider, sequencing stories and thinking about apostrophes for possession, a hard concept! In Maths, year 2 had lots of practical sessions making and showing fractions, whilst year 1 have been dividing numbers by grouping. Reception have worked on ordering, making and recognising numbers to 20 .
We have completed our learning on Ramadan and Eid in RE this week and in Geography researched about the climate and variation of landscapes in Africa.

The Acorn Star of the Week is Scott for brilliant number work - recognising, ordering and making the teen numbers.


Oaks have begun to learn about biographies and autobiographies and how to spot the difference between them. They have read a biography about Prince Philip, found the features of the text and identified different sentence types that it used. We have also begun our whole class book- The boy at the back of the class by Onjali Rauf.

In maths, the Y5/6 children have solved problems to do with time and converting different units to solve them. Y3/4 children have continued with fractions and in particular finding fractions of an amount.

PE has involved Cricket with Lewis and linking sequences in Gymnastics.
During our outdoor learning session we constructed a bird box and made a woodland mobile.
We also had the opportunity to plant some sunflower seeds which have been donated by Morrisons - we were delighted to receive a Seeds of Hope hamper and compost from them last week! $\%$ \% \%

## Arts Award Díscover

During this half term all of the children will be working towards Arts Award Discover. This is an introductory level to the Arts which allows the children to learn about a wide range of arts through participating in activities, researching artists and sharing their discoveries with each other.

The Acorns will be going on an arts hunt around the school grounds to identify as many art forms as they can. Their music sessions will be based around a Kenyan theme, where they will be discovering and learning a folk song and the artist, David Nzomo, who created it. The children will also find out about the Maasai tribe and learn how they dance.

The Oaks will be researching different art forms and making records of their findings in their very own log books. They will then research an art form or artist of their choice and produce something in the style of their chosen artist.

The final stage of the award will involve all children coming together to celebrate their discoveries with each other. Oak class will also be writing reflections about what they have learned in their log books.

On completion and submission, all children will receive an Arts Award Discover certificate from Trinity College, London.
