News from the Classes

This week the *Acorns* have been straight back to hard work and learning after a week off. We had the excitement of restarting Swimming lessons on Monday afternoon, a first for many in the class. Everyone was so organised and followed the safety instructions fabulously, they had a lovely session and enjoyed a run around at West Cliff School afterwards.

In Literacy, we have started a new unit of work on Poetry and have been enjoying reading lots of different poems by lots of different poets. We have been looking at rhyming words and adjectives and shall be using these next week to help us with writing our own poetry.

In Maths, Reception have been looking at sharing, Y1 have been looking at identifying coins and notes in Money and Y2 have been working on telling the time.

On Wednesday, when it was so hot in the classroom, we had a lovely afternoon outside in the shade. We used our new outdoor classroom as a base for our learning and it had a wonderful cosy feel about it.





This week **everyone is Star of the week** for being so fantastic both on the coach and at the swimming pool on Monday afternoon.



Just a reminder that the Acorns no longer have PE on a Tuesday (due to swimming on Monday) so their only PE session at school is on a Thursday morning. Please can they come to school ready in their PE kit on Thursdays and bring uniform with them to change into.

In the *Oak* classroom this week, for mathematics, the Y3 children have worked with capacity, the Y4 children have continued with decimals and the Y5/6 children have worked with circumference, centre, radius and diameter of circles and reading and interpreting pie charts.

For their writing work this week, they have written their dilemma stories that they planned before half term, edited their writing to ensure the opening caught the reader's attention and then peer assessed to further improve their editing.

We were recording and measuring temperature changes during outdoor learning this week so that we can use this data in a line graph and discuss what they found out from the recordings. We have also continued making our DT moving picture books according to our planning and prototypes that we made before beginning our books.

In PE, we began our swimming block on Monday and our tennis unit of work with Lewis on Thursday. We stayed in control and only lost a couple of tennis balls!

We would all like to wish Effie the best of luck in her new school, we will miss her!
