## Staffing Information

As is the case in many schools, both locally and nationally, our staffing levels have been unavoidably impacted by the ongoing pandemic, along with the usual seasonal illnesses. We are very fortunate in that we have a comparatively large staff team for the number of pupils on roll and, where possible and appropriate to do so, staff will step into each other's roles, showing great flexibility. We are also fortunate that a number of close friends of the school, including Mrs Grace, Mrs Scholey and Mrs Woolf, are able to provide high-quality additional external support, without the need for us to bring in unfamiliar supply staff. Unfortunately, it is not always possible to provide 'like for like' cover but please be assured that we are working closely with our extended staff team to limit the impact of staff absence on pupils. Thank you for your understanding and continued support.

## Forest Schools

As you may be aware, we have spent considerable time and money over recent months improving our outdoor areas in school, including the construction of a purpose-built outdoor classroom. We are incredibly lucky to have such extensive school grounds and have been working hard to develop our on-site outdoor learning provision, to ensure all pupils have regular access to this fantastic resource. Through our work with the North Yorkshire Educational Visits team, we continue to develop our outdoor learning curriculum to incorporate subject-specific learning activities, alongside the more familiar 'forest school' tasks, which reflects the latest thinking in good practice for learning outside the classroom. What this means in practice, is that children will continue to take their learning across a wide range of curriculum areas, including science, art, maths, etc. outside the classroom, in order to truly embed their learning within our unique setting.

We are currently working to resolve some logistical issues and intend to take some of our outdoor learning beyond the school gate as the year progresses, however, we are sure you will recognise the significant benefits in being able to access such a wide range of learning opportunities within our own grounds, and we will continue to extend and expand these over the coming months.
